Grand World Buffet in Torrance CA



Now, it is important to understand that I'm not talking about "cost-effective food". I'm talking "the best Asian I ever had", which also happens to be cheap!

How cheap? Hmmm...

Well the actual price, including unlimited soft-drinks and tax, **\$14.05.**

To put this in perspective, my first pic is a thoroughly-mediocre "fish" (I think) and "chips" (french-fries, cold ☹️) served in the Cayman Islands for the same \$14.05 price...



More perspective: For \$14, in the Caymans, *this isn't a bad meal...*
Ah! But I digress... My first plate-pile was all-seafood...



...consisting of baby clams, oysters (with oyster-sauce!), shrimp in lobster sauce, and **frogs legs** (which do **not** taste like chicken, but have their own wonderful flavor; Better still, these legs were super-plump!).

The second plate-pile was large-clams with cream-sauce, sautéed prawns, miniature sautéed octopus... Total Yum!



Moving down the line, I switched to **meat** and oh-what-a-treat this was...

The plate-pile consisted of barbecued chicken, satay chicken, barbecued pork, and yummy giant-mushrooms (in mushroom sauce? I dunno but superb)...

The pizza I rated B+ wow!

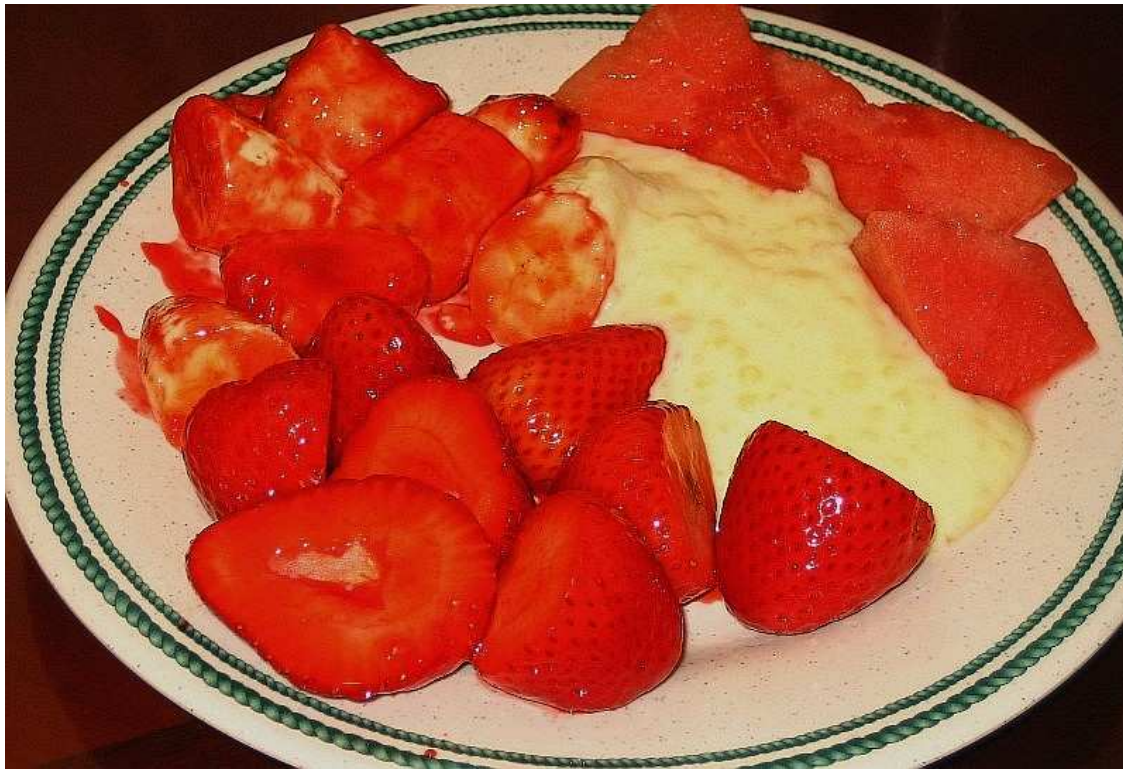


Oops I forgot the pic of the condiment/salad/dessert/fruit line...
